Grammar

The Greek verbs are built from a "stem" which gives the action of the verb, and a "personal ending" which says which "person" is doing the action of the verb

The "personal endings" of a verb show which "Person" is doing the action of the verb.

1st Person Singular = "I", 2nd Person Singular = "you", "thee", 3rd Person Singular = "he", "she", "it"

1st Person Plural = "we", 2nd Person Plural = "you". "y'all", 3rd Person Plural = "they"

Endings for the Present Active form of a Verb
