## Grammar

### Adjectives of the Third Declension

Third Declension Adjectives can be divided into two groups.

1. Comparative Adjectives, ending in **-ων -ον**

*Comparatives usually put the noun in the Genitive in Greek, whereas English tends to use "than".*

2. Adjectives ending in **-ης -ες**

For both groups, the Masculine and Feminine endings are the same, and the Neuter slightly different.

#### πλειων, πλειον - more

Singular	Masc/Fem	Neuter
Nom.	πλειων	πλειον
Acc.	πλειονα	πλειον
Gen.	πλειονος	πλειονος
Dat.	πλειοни	πλειοни
Plural		
Nom.	πλειονες	πλειонα
Acc.	πλειονας	πλειонα
Gen.	πλειοнων	πλειοнων
Dat.	πλεиосин	πλεиосин

Declined similarly : *These take the Genitive of the Noun*

κρεισσων - better

μειζων - greater

χειρων - worse

#### ἀληθης - true

Singular	Masc/Fem	Neuter
Nom.	ἀληθης	ἀληθες
Acc.	ἀληθη	ἀληθες
Gen.	ἀληθους	ἀληθους
Dat.	ἀληθει	ἀληθει
Plural		
Nom.	ἀληθεις	ἀληθη
Acc.	ἀληθеис	ἀληθη
Gen.	ἀληθων	ἀληθων
Dat.	ἀληθесин	ἀληθесин

Declined similarly :

ἀσθενης - weak, ill

πληρης - full
