Grammar - Adverbs

Adverbs describe the action of a verb :

The dog ran quickly. The student worked well. The prophet spoke truly

Kinds of Adverbs

- 1. Adverbs of manner describe how something was done. "The students worked quickly"
- 2. Adverbs of time describe when something was done. "The students worked yesterday"
- 3. Adverbs of place describe where something was done "The students worked there"
- 4. Adverbs of degree qualify another adverb or adjective "The students worked quite hard"
- 5. Interrogative Adverbs ask about the action. How? Where? Why? When? : "When" did the students work?

Adverbs of manner are generally formed from Adjectives by changing the $-\omega\nu$ of the genitive plural into $-\omega\varsigma$

καλος - good	καλως - well
κακος - bad	κακως - in a bad manner
όρθος - straight, upright	όρθως - properly, correctly
όμοιος - like	
ούτος - this	ούτως - in this manner, thus
περισσος - excessive	περισσως - exceedingly
άληθης - true	ἀληθως - truly
ταχυς - quick, fast	ταχεως, ταχυ - quickly
εύθυς - straight, level	εύθεως, εύθυς - immediately
