Prepositions

A **preposition** is a word used with a noun or pronoun to show the relation of the thing denoted by the noun to something else. The preposition in generally in a position just before (pre-) the noun. Prepositions may have originated as adverbs.

Besides standing alone, they may also form Compounds, in which they are joined to a verb or a noun. For free prepositions (not part of a compound):

If the noun is in the **Accusative**, the preposition may indicate "movement towards" If the noun is in the **Genitive**, the preposition may indicate "movement away from" If the noun is in the **Dative**, the preposition may indicate "rest in place"
