The Present Indicative Active of Contract Verbs

Contract Verbs are those whose Stem ends in a Vowel

When the vowel of the Stem comes next to the vowel of an ending, they “contract” to give one broad vowel.

The general rules are :

$$\alpha + \omega = \omega$$

$$\epsilon + \epsilon = \epsilon i$$

$$\circ + \text{long vowel} = \omega$$

$$\alpha + o = \omega$$

$$\epsilon + o = ou$$

$$\circ + \text{short vowel or } ou = ou$$

$$\alpha + ou = \omega$$

ϵ next to a long vowel

$\circ + \text{combination containing } l = ol$

$$\alpha + \epsilon = \alpha$$

or diphthong drops out

$$\alpha + \eta = \alpha$$

$$\alpha + \text{combination containing } l = \alpha$$
