Short Vocabulary - Adverbs

Adverbs of Manner	Adverbs of Time
<p>ἀληθως - truly ἀμην - truly (Hebrew), surely δικαιως - righteously εὖ - well καλως - well κακως - in a bad manner ὁμοιως - in a similar manner ὀρθως - properly, correctly οὕτως - in this manner, thus ταχεως, ταχυ, ταχειον - quickly</p>	<p>ἄρτι - now εἴτεν, εἶτα - then, next εὐθυς, εὐθεως - immediately, straightaway ἔτι - still, yet οὐκετι, μηκετι - no longer ἤδη - already, by this time, now νυν - at the present time, now παλιν - again ποτε - ever, at any time οὐδεποτε, μηδεποτε - never πωποτε - ever, at any time σημερον - today τοτε - then παντοτε - always ἀπαξ - once δις - twice τρις - thrice ἑπτακις - seven times δεκακις - ten times</p>
Adverbs of Degree *	Adverbs of Place
<p>μαλλον - more, rather μαλιστα - most, most of all, specially μονον - only ὀλιγον - a little πολυ, πολλα - much, greatly</p>	<p>ἄλλαχοθεν - from another place ἄλλαχου - to another place ἀνωθεν - from above, again ἐγγυς - near ἐκει - there ἐκειθεν - thence, from there ἔμπροσθεν - before, in front of ἔσωθεν - within, from within ὅπου - where πανταχου - in all directions, everywhere παντοθεν - from all directions ὧδε - here</p>
Interrogative Adverbs	
<p>ποθεν ; - whence? from where? how? why? ποτε ; - when ? που ; - where ? πως ; - how? how is it possible? in what way?</p>	

* - The "Adverbs of Degree" are really Neuter Adjectives (in the Accusative) used adverbially
